Program Abstract:

This one-day workshop begins with an overview of the system approach in the management of error and introduction to human factors engineering principles. Root cause analysis (RCA) is a tool to help investigate adverse events and critical incidents in healthcare, identify and analyze root causes and contributing factors, and develop recommendations. Procedures on how to conduct an RCA will be demonstrated through interactive exercises and group work. The facilitator will go through causal statements, actions, and outcome measurement used in RCA. Participants will also learn about diagramming and identification of contributing factors through case studies in pharmacy practice.

DRIVING:

FROM THE WEST

Take highway 401 EAST. Take the exit at Yonge Street (EXIT 369) NORTH. Turn right onto Yonge. Before you reach Sheppard Avenue you will see the Proctor & Gamble building (4711 Yonge Street) on your right. Turn right on the driveway (Poyntz Ave.) at the north end of the building and buzz security for entry to the underground parking (tell them you are attending a meeting at ISMP Canada).

FROM THE SOUTH

Travel NORTH on Yonge Street past highway 401. Before you reach Sheppard Avenue you will see the Proctor & Gamble building (4711 Yonge Street) on your right. Turn onto Poyntz Ave. to access the underground parking. Buzz security for entry.

PARKING:

Turn right at the set of lights on the north side of the P & G building (Poyntz Ave.) to reach the underground parking entrance. Buzz security at the gate and let them know that you are visiting ISMP Canada. Park on Level P2. Take the elevator to the Lobby to obtain a visitor pass. Security can help you access the meeting room.

SUBWAY/TTC:

Take the Yonge line to Sheppard Subway Station. For direct access through the walkway, take the escalator at the **Yonge Street and Poyntz Avenue exit**. When you reach the top pass through the turnstile, you will see a set of doors directly in front of you. This is the entrance to the Proctor & Gamble building's course level. Continue down the corridor and take the escalator to the Lobby to obtain a visitor pass. Security can help you access the meeting room.

You may also exit Sheppard Subway Station at the Sheppard – Yonge Street southeast exit. Walk one block south to 4711 Yonge Street. Go to security desk to obtain a visitor pass. Security can help you access the meeting room.
