The Health Quality Council of Alberta, as an organization dedicated to improving patient safety and health service quality, fully supports the efforts of ISMP-Canada and CPSI to establish voluntary national standards for automated identification of pharmaceuticals in Canada through a unique collaborative process that has engaged a broad scope of stakeholders.

We endorse the resulting Joint Technical Statement on Pharmaceuţical Automated Identification and Product Database Requirements as an important step to improving medication safety in all sectors of the health care system.
