

## Case Review Services Available for Offices of the Chief Coroner and Chief Medical Examiner

Informal telephone advice/opinion on investigative approach for death investigations	Complimentary; funded through CMIRPS <sup>2</sup>
Sharing of analysis findings through an ISMP Canada Safety Bulletin	Complimentary; funded through CMIRPS
Brief case review to address 1-2 specific questions identified by the investigating coroner or medical examiner. Includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Telephone consultation with investigating coroner/medical examiner</li> <li>• Review of coroner/medical examiner case summary</li> <li>• Limited review of health record and selected investigative documents</li> <li>• Provision of brief (e.g., 1-3 pages) summary report</li> </ul>	Standard fee of \$500 with additional in-kind support from CMIRPS
Case analysis to identify potential contributing factors and suggested actions to reduce the likelihood of recurrence. Includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Telephone consultation with investigating coroner/medical examiner</li> <li>• Review of coroner/medical examiner case summary</li> <li>• Review of health record and available investigative documents</li> <li>• Provision of summary report (e.g., 5-15 pages)</li> </ul>	Standard fee of \$1500 with additional in-kind support from CMIRPS
Full critical incident analysis, including site visit (e.g., inquest) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Telephone consultation with investigating coroner/medical examiner</li> <li>• Review of coroner/medical examiner case summary</li> <li>• Review of health record and available investigative documents</li> <li>• Review of expert reports, if applicable</li> <li>• Provision of detailed summary report (20+ pages)</li> <li>• Presentation of findings</li> <li>• Support for coroner's counsel related to analysis findings</li> </ul>	~ \$5000 - \$10,000 + incurred expenses  (In-kind support from CMIRPS to be determined based on case particulars)
